

Job Description: Dredge Master

Reports to: Dredging Superintendent / Works Manager and/or Project Manager during operational periods; Technical Superintendent during repair periods.

Position Summary: The Dredge Master commands the vessel with the overarching responsibility for all operations, maintenance, and safety. This senior role demands not only navigational expertise but also a profound commitment to environmental stewardship and crew welfare.

Responsibilities:

- **Vessel Command:** Serves as the master of the vessel, exercising authority over all activities and decisions pertaining to the vessel's operations and crew safety.
- **Operational Management:** Oversees the vessel's optimal operation and maintenance in accordance with both international and national maritime laws.
- **Safety and Environmental Leadership:** Assumes full responsibility for the safe navigation and operation of the ship, proactive environmental protection, and adherence to pollution prevention protocols.
- **Emergency Response:** Takes immediate and appropriate action in emergency situations in compliance with company emergency procedures.
- **Maintenance Supervision:** Directs and reviews the ship's maintenance activities, ensuring compliance with both company regulations and industry standards.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Ensures the vessel's operations are in line with Safety Management System (SMS) and International Safety Management (ISM) codes.
- **Documentation Control:** Manages ship documents and records, overseeing the preparation of necessary reports and submissions to authorities.
- **Crew Management:** Verifies the certification and competency of officers and crew are in line with international conventions and standards.
- **Safety Meetings:** Chairs safety committee meetings, ensuring all safety concerns are addressed and communicated to relevant parties.
- **Navigation Preparedness:** Prepares the ship for sea, ensuring it is fully equipped and safe for the intended dredging work.
- **Advisory Role:** Provides expertise to the Superintendent regarding nautical aspects of the project, selection of auxiliary equipment, and the planning of work processes such as cutting patterns and shore connection.
