Memorandum of Understanding

Between

BC Ferries Services Inc. ("the Company")

And

BC Ferry & Marine Workers' Union ("the Union")

WHEREAS the Company and Union wish to confirm the Collective Agreement terms around casual scheduling and casual recall.

Casual Scheduling:

- The term block is understood to mean any number of days available for assignment to a particular casual.
- A casual is expected to be available for assignment per Art. 8.07 and will not suffer a loss of assignment opportunities when 8.07(c) applies, or on approved casual unavailability.

Casual Recall Process:

The casual recall process shall be utilised for both long-term planning and short-term scheduling desk recall opportunities:

- 1. A block of days available for assignment would be offered to the senior qualified casual.
- 2. The casual confirms the number of days they are available.
- 3. Any remaining days form the next set of days that would be offered to the next senior qualified casual.
- 4. The process repeats until all recall opportunities are assigned.

The example below provides an application of the process:

- 1. A block of 8 days is offered to the senior qualified casual.
- 2. The casual confirms they are available for the 6 of the 8 days. (Days 1-4, 7, 8). This casual is assigned the 6 days.
- 3. The remaining 2 days form part of the next block offered to the next senior qualified casual.
- 4. The process repeats until all recall opportunities are assigned.

Collective Agreement:

- Casual Recall: Article 8.08 (E) would be applied without change in application or interpretation; once shifts are confirmed, the Company does not realign schedules or move people around for substitution.
- With the exception of the provisions outlined above, all terms of the Collective Agreement will apply.

This agreement is made on a without prejudice and without precedent basis.
